

Bee Cave Book Club


Thursday, November 14 7- 8 p.m.

It's no secret that reading books to babies promotes language development. But we try to take those opportunities beyond simply reading at Bee Cave Public Library's BabyBumblebees Lapsit Storytime. We sing songs (with words posted for grownups) that include actions and sometimes sign language. We clap and wiggle and wave to our Storytime mascot, the Bee Cave Bee puppet. And that's all before the playtime and bubbles begin! Mostly we hope our infant Storytime is a chance for babies and their caregivers to bond through engaging language experiences and even physical closeness, such as cuddling up to read a board book designed just for babies. Plus, an added benefit of this Storytime is the chance for caregivers of the very young to find community. We would love for all the Bee Cave babies and the grownups in their lives to join us for BabyBumblebees.

FIVE TECHIE TIPS FOR OVERDRIVE

1. Make sure your WiFi is on and you are connected to a network before you start trying to download. You'd be amazed how often you think you are automatically logged on when you aren't, best to double check before you start.
2. If you are using a Kindle and have more than one device, make sure you select the correct device to send your eBook to. Also make sure that the Amazon account you are using is the one connected to your Kindle.
3. When using Libby, the OverDrive app, try using the preference option at the top of the screen. You can set your preferences for age levels, device compatibility, and even select "available now" so you only see items that are currently available for check out.
4. If you suddenly find yourself unable to access your account, check to make sure your library card isn't expired. BCPL's cards need to be renewed every year. Other problems include a change in your library PIN or having too many checkouts. If you have 20 physical items checked out, you will be unable to check out OverDrive items. Think of OverDrive as one item that counts towards your check out limit.
5. When the app seems to be really acting up or quitting unexpectedly, sometimes it really is as simple as turning the device on and off again or uninstalling then reinstalling the app.



Still having problems? Contact the library and set up an appointment with me. I will do everything I can to get you up and running with OverDrive. While I can't reset your Amazon passwords or fix a broken screen, I can probably find the answers you need to download all the latest eBooks and eAudiobooks.
